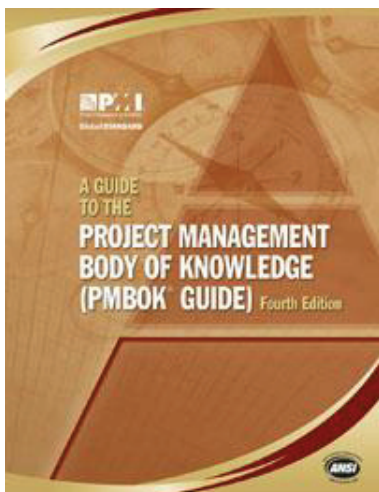


Standards

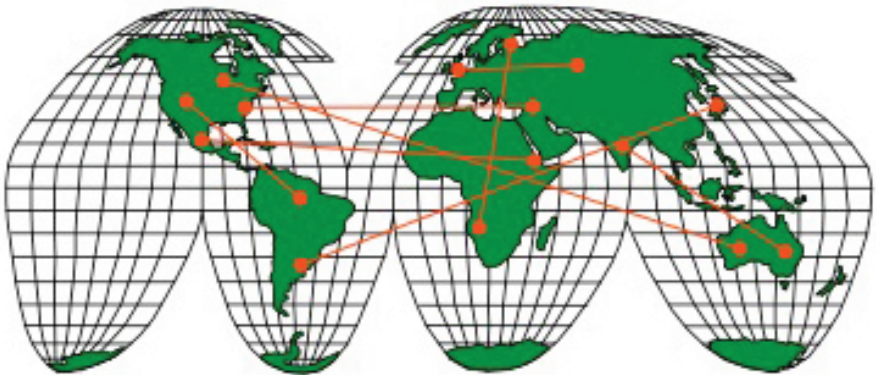


Why become a PMP?

To have your PMI credentials demonstrates a commitment to the Project Management profession. In fact, many organisations are now seeking project practitioners with industry-based qualifications.



The PMP credential is recognised all over the world and can strengthen your opportunities in job placement, advancement, promotion and professional recognition.





Become a PMP

To become a PMP, you must satisfy certain eligibility requirements before you are able to sit the exam.

You should:

- > Work in project management
- > Have a high school diploma
- > If you have a Bachelor Degree, have a minimum of three years / 4500 hours in work experience leading and directing projects
 - > If you do not have a Bachelor Degree, have a minimum of five years / 7500 hours in work experience leading and directing projects
 - > Have a minimum 35 hours project management training (see Melbourne Chapter courses).

Successful applicants can generate a profile and apply on-line at www.pmi.org. The application does not need to be completed in one sitting.

You will receive an email from PMI confirming detail about booking your exam sitting (or you are being audited).



The PMP Exam

The multiple choice exam runs for four hours maximum and consists of 200 multiple choice questions. You will require 61% correct answers or more correct to pass.

Basis for questions:

Initiating	11%
Planning	23%
Executing	27%
Controlling	21%
Closing	9%
Professional responsibility	9%

Computer based exams are available in Sydney and Melbourne centres (operated by Thomson-Prometric). Date and time bookings are made on-line via the Prometric web site.

You will get your exam results a few minutes after you submit your exam!



The PMP Investment

PMP Application and Exam Fees:

- > US\$555 – non members
- > US\$405 – members

You pay this only after your application is approved. A relatively high percentage of people fail their PMP exam at the 1st attempt. Trainees that have obtained there 35 hour training requirement through the Melbourne Chapter trainees have a very low failure record to date!

Once you have obtained your credential, Your PMP status must be renewed every three years by obtaining 60 points (PDUs) via:

- > Attending the monthly Chapter events
- > Formal education
- > Self directed activities
- > Training courses
- > Service to professional or community organisations



CAPM

The Certified Associate in Project Management (CAPM) exam is aimed at people moving into the project management profession.

- > There are approaching 6,000 CAPMs
- > The CAPM exam is focused exclusively on the PMBoK Guide
- > It consists of 150 questions
- > Runs for 3 hours
- > The pass mark is 65%
- > Application processes and other information generally as per PMP

To apply, a candidate needs either

- > 1500 hours of project experience, or
- > 23 hours of PM training

The CAPM qualification lasts for 5 years then you may either re-sit the CAPM examination, or move up to the Project Management Professional (PMP).



The CAPM Investment

CAPM Application and Exam Fees:

- > US\$300 - non member rate
- > US\$225 - member rate

The Melbourne Chapter has three different course methods to study for the CAPM examination. They are:

- > **Intensive:**
Full time, Monday to Thursday
- > **Fast track:**
Four weekly full day sessions (Friday)
- > **Saturday Series:**
Four weekly full day sessions (Saturday)
